THE COMPOSITION


Uncle Lumpy's Garage is a fantasy piece that, hopefully, is lots of fun to perform. It allows the percussion section to explore new sound sources in addition to traditional ones, and it features rhythmically punctuated materials from the winds. One might imagine an older man (don't we all know an "Uncle Lumpy?") working diligently in his garage, tinkering and hammering away, trying to make the machines of his life work again, and perhaps even inventing some of his own.

The work was premiered on May 17, 2005, by the Northfield (Minnesota) Middle School 6th Grade Band, guest conducted by Timothy Mahr and including Jenna Mahr on snare drum and tam-tam.


